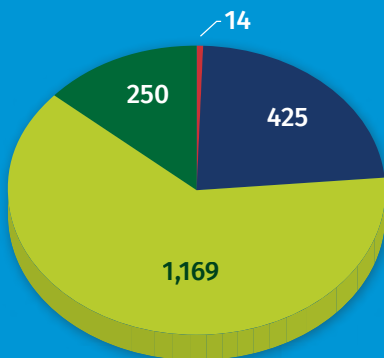

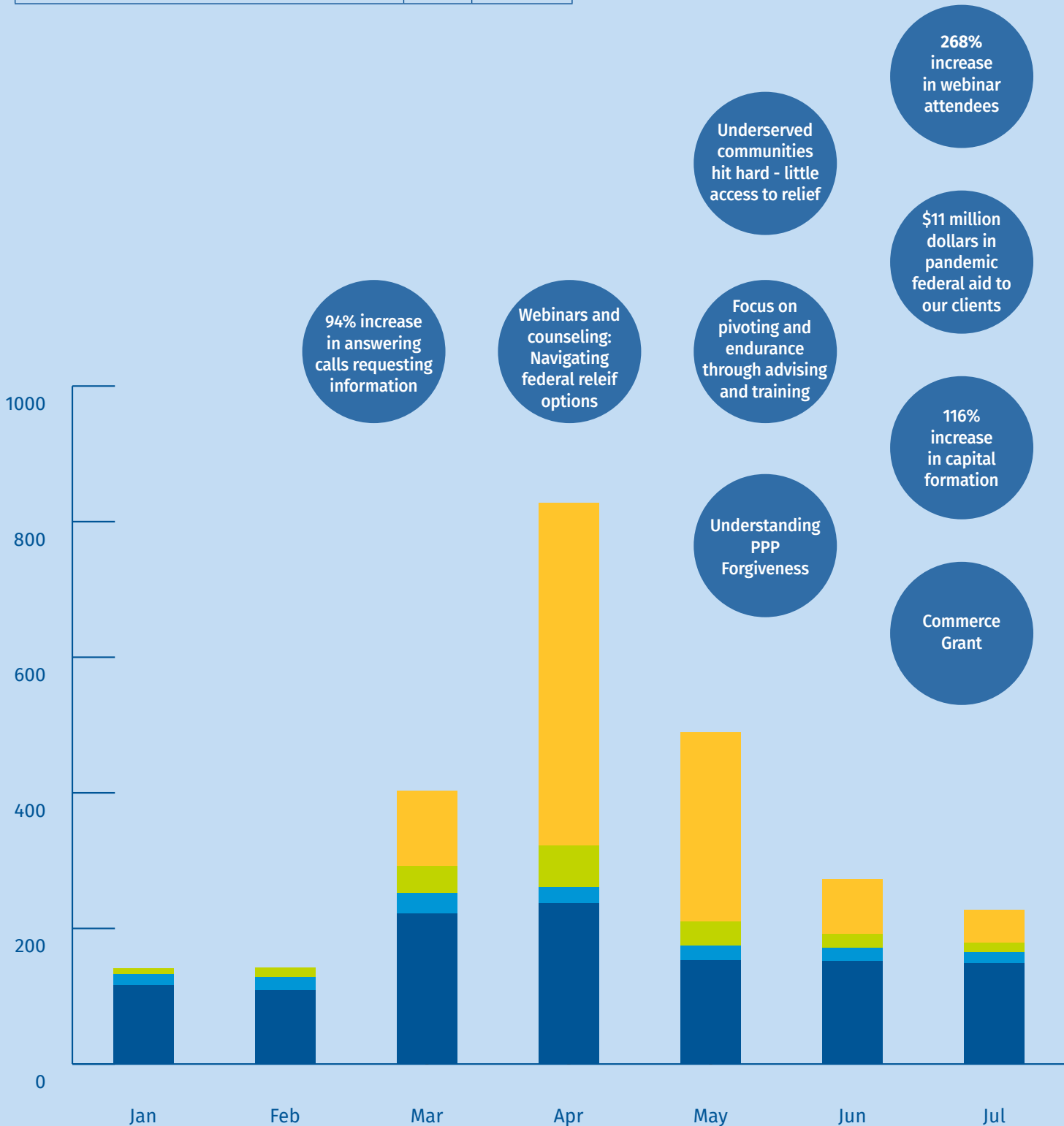

I'm deeply grateful for all of you, and even more grateful that we all have each other.

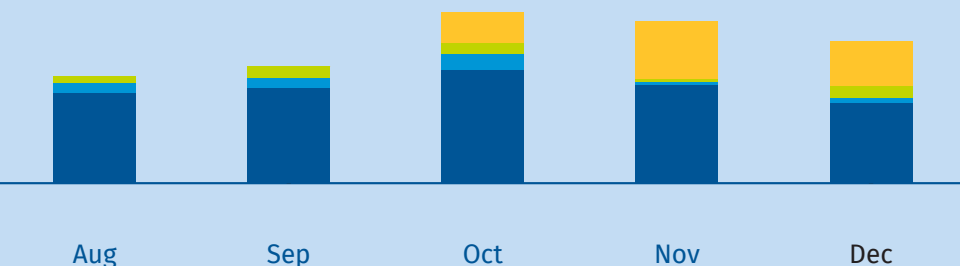
